PROGRAM UPDATES

SFY23 TRS Baseline

DODD is reviewing submitted inquiries and incorporating applicable data into the final analysis. Results memos are scheduled to be sent to counties by March 24.

SFY23 45-Day Timeline Baseline

The SFY23 45-Day baseline process is under way for Group 1 counties. Data were extracted on March 2 and the initial analysis is underway. Applicable county inquiries will be sent by March 15 and will be due back to DODD by March 30.

When responding to any requested inquiries, please review your response carefully to ensure all requested information is present. There have been many instances during the SFY23 baseline analyses of missing and incomplete information in submissions to DODD. This has necessitated additional requests for information and clarifications from local programs, potentially impacting a program's compliance determination for a baseline indicator. Annual Ohio Center for Deafblind Education (OCDBE) Parent Retreat



New Profile Fields in DODD MyLearning

Beginning March 13, when users log in to DODD MyLearning, they will be asked to review and confirm their MyLearning profile information. Two optional fields have been added to the MyLearning profile: *OPIN* and *Developmental Center*.

- *OPIN* is for people who are registered with the Ohio Professional Registry through the Ohio Child Care Resource and Referral Association (OCCRRA). If you have an OPIN select "Yes" and enter your number in the field provided. If you do not have an OPIN, select "No."
- The *Developmental Center* (DC) field is for employees of DODD's eight developmental centers. DC employees should select their location from the options available. If you are not employed by a DC, leave blank or select "Not Applicable."
