#### **State Targets**

- Ohio uses a three-year monitoring cycle for analyses of the compliance indicators. El programs were selected to be included in the analysis for one of the three indicators in SFY17, another in SFY18, and the last in SFY19. Shelby County was selected for the Transition analysis for SFY19.

#### **Data Summary**

- TRS: All children with services due to start between January 1, 2019 and March 31, 2019
- 45 Day: Children referred between November 17, 2018 and February 14, 2019
- Transition Steps and Services: Self-assessment data for a sample of children who had Transition Steps and Services due between July 1, 2018 and September 30, 2018
- **Notification to LEA and SEA:** Reports submitted to the lead agency for children who would be turning three between February 1, 2019 and January 31, 2020
- TPC: Children who had a TPC due between July 1, 2018 and September 30, 2018
- **Services in Natural Environments:** Infants or toddlers served on December 1, 2018 who were receiving the majority of services in the home or in community-based settings
- Child Outcomes: Scores from entry and exit COS statements of children who exited between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019 and were served in Early Intervention for at least six months indicating those who (1) substantially increased their growth or (2) exited at age expectations in relation to (a) positive social-emotional skills, (b) acquiring and using knowledge and skills, and (c) taking appropriate actions to meet their needs
- Family Outcomes: Scores of respondent families who were being served in Early Intervention on June 1, 2019 who reported that early intervention services have helped the family (a) know their rights, (b) communicate their children's needs, (c) help their children develop and learn
- **Birth to 1 Child Count:** Number of children under age one served on December 1, 2018 compared to the 2010 population estimate
- **Birth to 3 Child Count:** Number of children under age three served on December 1, 2018 compared to the 2010 population estimate
