### **SFY16 Child Count and Settings Data**

As described in EI Program Update #1608, Ohio recently submitted SFY16/FFY15 Child Count and Settings data to OSEP. For the reporting year, the state Settings percentage is 95.64%, meaning nearly 96% of our children have the majority of their services occurring in natural environments.

In response to requests from counties to have access to data in a timelier manner, we created one page reports for each county that summarize the county's SFY16/FFY15 Child Count and Settings data.
