MESSAGE FROM THE PART C COORDINATOR

I am very pleased to tell you that on May 25, the Ohio House and Senate passed HB 483. This bill contained a number of provisions. Of particular interest to you is that this bill transfers Part C lead agency status from ODH to DODD with a tentative effective date of July 1, 2016. The bill has been sent to Governor Kasich for signature. State EI staff from both agencies are very excited about this change as it gives us the opportunity to better meet the needs of the field and thus improve outcomes for families and children. When we learn more details about the actual implementation, we will keep you posted. As you know, ODH and DODD staff began more closely integrating their efforts in February of this year, so we are optimistic about a continued smooth transition. Thank you for your patience.

Because the legislation passed sooner than we anticipated, we will be posting, in the coming days, a new Part C application to the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) that specifies DODD as the lead agency for Ohio. Once complete, the application will be posted for public comment on the HMG website here:


Family Questionnaire

Early Track Access

You do not need to send user agreements for non-system administrators (*e.g.*, service coordinators) to state staff.
