#### **SFY16** Transition Baseline

Activities related to the SFY16 Transition baseline analysis will begin soon. Notification details are being sent out today via e-mail identifying which programs will be participating and outlining timelines. Please note that this information is being provided in the form of an email, as opposed to a separate memo. For those included in the Transition analysis, the data cleaning period runs from August 1 to August 15. Data extraction will occur on August 29. # **Family Questionnaire**

As we prepare to send the 2016 Family Questionnaire we ask that each County check to ensure that all child exits have been entered both timely and accurately in the data system. *Families with an exit reason of "Child is deceased" are excluded from receiving the questionnaire, so it is crucial that this information be up to date out of respect for families.* Thank you for your assistance.

# FFY15 Child Outcomes Data

We will be extracting Child Outcomes Summary data for the FFY15 APR in the coming weeks. Data will include children who were exited between July 1, 2015 and June 30, 2016. Please enter any outstanding exit information for children who were exited within this time period as soon as possible.

# **Ohio's FFY14 Determination from OSEP**

As referenced in EI Program Updates #1614, all states recently received their determination from the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP). OSEP continued to use both results and compliance data to make state determinations. The compliance data portion included Indicators 1 (Timely Receipt of Services), 7 (45 Day Timeline), 8A (IFSP Steps and Services), 8B (Notification to the LEA and SEA) and 8C (Timely Transition Planning Conferences). The results portion of the score was comprised of several different calculations around the child outcomes scores. This included completeness and validity of the data, comparison to the previous year of data in the state, and comparison to the same year of data to all states. Percentages were calculated for both the compliance data portion and the results data portion. The final result is an average of the two percentages. States need a score of at least 80% to receive a determination of Meets Requirements and at least 60% to receive a determination of Needs Assistance. With a total score of 75%, Ohio received the determination of Needs Assistance. You can access states' determinations here:
