PROGRAM UPDATES

SFY18 Service Coordination Grant

In preparation for the SFY18 service coordination grant, we will be pulling data related to *calendar* year 2016 referrals and children served. The formula for creating the SFY18 allocation table will continue to be based on a combination of referrals and children served, as it has the past two years. Please ensure that your data are up-to-date no later than February 28 as we will be pulling data March 1.

Child Outcomes Summary Data

SFY16 COS data files were sent to counties on February 7. DODD will be sending data files that include COS data for children exiting between July 1, 2016 and December 31, 2016 this month, as well as quarterly data thereafter until COS reports are available in Early Track. SFY17 45-Day Baseline

Activities related to the SFY17 45-Day baseline analysis are underway. Analysis of LEA reports is in progress and memos are expected to go out the week of February 20.

Play and Language for Autistic Youngsters (PLAY) Project Training

In collaboration with DODD and the Childhood League Center, OCALI has released a new webinar around the intersection of the PLAY Project and the IFSP Process. The webinar is approximately 30 minutes long and explores the incorporation of the PLAY Project in Ohio's Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) for Early Intervention.

The webinar starts with a review of the IFSP process, from referral through identification of services, steps, and activities. Next, it explains how any strategy or intervention is chosen to support outcomes and to match a family's priorities and values. It then describes how PLAY may be chosen to support outcomes and to match a family's priorities and values and how a PLAY Consultant may participate in the eligibility and assessment process. The module ends with an explanation of the role of the PLAY Consultant on the IFSP Team.

As a result of this training, participants will—

- Understand how and when PLAY may be selected as an intervention,
- Know how and when a PLAY Consultant may participate in the IFSP process, and
- Understand the role of a PLAY Consultant on the IFSP team.
