PROGRAM UPDATES

SFY17 Service Coordination Grant Budget Revisions

Please remember that any budget revisions for the SFY17 service coordination grant are due in GMIS no later than May 1.

SFY18 Service Coordination Grant

The intent to enter into a multi-county grant agreement must be shared with Chad Hibbs via email prior to May 1, 2017 so that the allocations resulting from the multi-county grant agreements are properly loaded into the grants system.

Instructions for requesting roles in EIGS (the DODD grant system for EI) will be included in the grant agreement, which DODD plans to post prior to May 1. People familiar with the process for requesting roles may not require instructions; however, we are asking that roles are not requested until the grant agreements are released. We are working with our IT staff to finalize the number of EIGS users we can allow per county. Those details will be communicated in the grant agreement.

May 1 Quarterly LEA Reports

The May 1 LEA quarterly report requirement is approaching. The report may be run no earlier than April 21, 2017 and must be sent to the appropriate LEAs no later than May 1, 2017. Please do *not* submit copies to DODD, but you are encouraged to maintain copies on file.

If you are not sure which LEA should be selected for a specific child (e.g., foster care situation), we encourage you to contact the ESC for clarification. Contact information for all of the ESCs and Public School Districts, along with a map of districts, is available here:

Please remember that parent's rights apply to any shared information if personally identifying details are disclosed.

We know that there is an issue with some records where the service coordinator's name is not appearing on the quarterly LEA report. The service coordinator's name is not a federal requirement, so please be sure to send the LEA report to your local school districts as is. We will work to get a fix to the report for future reporting.

SFY17 45-Day Baseline

Activities related to the SFY17 45-Day baseline analysis are underway. Verification, if applicable, and final analyses are nearly complete. Results memos are scheduled to be sent on April 25.

Transition Baseline

Activities related to the SFY17 Transition Steps and Services and Transition Planning Conference (TPC) baseline analyses are scheduled to begin next week. Counties will receive an initial email regarding their inclusion in the analyses. For counties included in the Transition analyses, the data cleaning period runs from April 24 to May 8.

Early Track User Account Addition and Removal

To add or remove users from Early Track, please see the "3.15.16 How to Add-Modify an ET User" document under the ET Info heading of Early Track. Please note that users who have the Early Intervention *System Administrator* role can have that role added or removed only by contacting <u>ETDS@odh.ohio.gov</u>. For removal, access can either be revoked immediately or scheduled in advance of the user's last day needing Early Track access.

Webinar Series: Engaging Families and Creating Trusting Partnerships to Improve Child and Family Outcomes
