PROGRAM UPDATES

SFY18 Central Coordination Changes

A memo from Directors Himes and Martin outlining changes to Central Coordination beginning in SFY18 was released yesterday. It is also posted here <u>http://ohioearlyintervention.org/program-updates</u>. DODD understands that stakeholders have many questions. As we obtain answers to these questions, we will be sure to communicate them. We also appreciate that these are significant changes, and we will be working with stakeholders to support them in implementing these changes.

System of Payments Rule

JCARR and OSEP have now both approved DODD's proposed SOP rule. In addition, ODH is in the process of rescinding the existing rules governing Ohio's EI system of payments. The new DODD rule will have an implementation date of August 1, 2017. Trainings for service coordinators on implementation of the rule have been happening across the state and will be completed later this month. Katrina Busch will also be offering several webinar opportunities to walk through the rule text in detail. A version of the training for service coordinators will be recorded in July/August and available online. In addition, DODD will be preparing answers to the many questions we received during the in-person SOP trainings for service coordinators. In the coming weeks, updated forms and guidance about the SOP will be posted to the EI website on the System of Payments tab.

Credential Deadlines

Please remember that service coordinators, service coordinator supervisors, and developmental specialists are responsible for monitoring their credential end dates and seeking renewal with sufficient lead time. *If a credential lapses, personnel will not be able to perform those activities*

for which a credential is required. In those cases, a different person with an active credential must be assigned to the family to provide services.

Transition Baseline

Activities related to the SFY17 Transition Steps and Services and Transition Planning Conference (TPC) baseline analyses are underway. County inquiries, including Steps Self-Assessments and missing data and verification requests (as applicable) were sent June 8 and are due back to DODD by the end of the day today, June 23. Please note that all 30 counties participating in the Transition baseline process need to complete and submit a Steps Self-Assessment. As a reminder, the Self-Assessment refers to "Specific steps or activities that will be taken to accomplish this outcome (including criteria & timeline)" in Section IX of the IFSP. Service Coordination Agency Changes

Question: My county is changing contracted service coordination agencies July 1. What do we do with the records? How long are we required to keep them?

Answer: Per OAC 3701-8-09(B)(4), all records must be retained on paper or electronically for six years from the date of last receipt of payment for services. If the FCFC administrative agent has chosen to change service coordination sub-contractors, a decision should be made locally about who will retain custody of the records (e.g., will the new service coordination agency get the originals or copies, will the administrative agent store them for the old agency, etc.). As long as they are maintained for the required time period, it does not matter which agency stores them. Please make sure exited families are aware of which agency to contact in order to gain access to their records. Administrative agents should consider covering this issue in their contracts with service coordination agencies. A memorandum of understanding between the service coordination agencies that covers transition, and other topics that arise when programs transfer, is also an excellent way of ensuring a smooth transition for all affected parties.

Early Track User Accounts

As the start of SFY18 approaches, all Early Track System Administrators are asked to verify user accounts in their county and make any needed changes as soon as possible. Please be sure to verify first and last name, email address, and all roles associated with Early Intervention accounts. System of Payments Rule Overview

Katrina Bush of DODD will provide an overview of the new "Early intervention services – system of payments" rule (5123:2-10-01) anticipated to take effect August 1, 2017. NEW! Motivational Interviewing Training

Beginning this summer, Robert Gallen, PhD will provide training on Motivational Interviewing in Early Intervention. Entitled, "*Tough Conversations: Making the Most of Difficult Situations*," Dr. Gallen's training is designed to build the confidence and competence of service providers and service coordinators in supporting families. The training will address difficult situations families may face, such as mental illness, addiction, homelessness, and coping with a child's diagnosis. Dr. Gallen will offer strategies for communicating with families in these challenging situations. The training will be offered as a *facilitated webinar* on July 13, 2017 and an *in-person training* on September 7, 2017 and September 8, 2017 in Columbus (it is only necessary to attend one session).

Dr. Gallen is a Licensed Psychologist and Associate Professor of Psychology. He has served as an EI provider since 1998 and teaches graduate level courses in Assessment and Family Therapy. He is a Regional Trainer for the Battelle Developmental Inventory-2 and has completed research projects on the early identification of child psychopathology. He teaches Reflective Supervision and Childhood Trauma for Ohio's Early Intervention and Home Visiting staff.

Practitioner Volunteers Needed for New Child Outcomes Summary Resource

Would you like to help meet a great need in the early intervention and early childhood special education community by furthering the development of a national Child Outcomes Summary (COS) process training resource? The DaSy and ECTA Centers are recruiting practitioners who participate in the COS process to field test the new COS Competency Check (COS-CC). The COS-CC is an online tool intended to assess practitioners' understanding of the essential knowledge and skills needed to reach accurate ratings of child outcomes using the COS process.

Why is the COS Competency Check important?

Practitioners must have the necessary knowledge to accurately assign COS ratings, such as knowledge of the 7-point COS scale and age-expected development. Until the COS-CC, there has not been a tool available to states/local programs to reliably differentiate between practitioners with sufficient knowledge and those with too little. Ensuring that practitioners are capable of assigning accurate ratings is a critical factor in improving the quality of child outcomes data obtained through the COS process. Having high-quality child outcomes data allows programs to better use those data to make informed decisions about services and supports for families and children.

What is the purpose of the field test?

The field test will give DaSy and ECTA an opportunity to test the assessment system in actual conditions with intended users, and to gather initial data on the validity and reliability of the assessment items. Following the field test, the tool will roll-out for national use in September 2017.

When will the field test take place?

The COS-CC field test will take place from approximately July 24-August 18, 2017. Volunteers can work on the assessment at their own pace during that 4-week timeframe, and therefore, do not have to be available during the entire window. More information will be provided in a follow-up email to those practitioners who express interest in participating in the field test.

Field test volunteers who complete the COS-CC to the best of their ability will be eligible to win a \$100 Amazon gift card! A drawing will take place by September 1 to select six winners.
