PROGRAM UPDATES

EI Local Outreach Funds

All FCFC coordinators and EI contract managers should have received an e-mail on September 22 that outlined details about the funds DODD is making available for local outreach for EI. The first quarter's payments to counties have been processed. We would like to reiterate that these are state, not federal, funds and you will *not* report on these funds in EIGS. A report template accompanied last week's e-mail, and counties will use this template to report twice a year on the EI local outreach activities these funds supported.

County Level EI Data

DODD has put several years of county-level EI referral and child count data on the EI website here:

These data are updated monthly. Since we are still correcting errors with August referrals, we do not anticipate having August numbers posted until early October. September referral numbers should be posted in early November. If you have questions about your data, please do not hesitate to contact us.

EI Referral Transfer from Early Track to EIDS

DODD IT developers have continued to work to resolve the issues with the transfer of EI referrals from Early Track to EIDS. DODD is in the final stages of testing a potential fix that may be deployed 9/29 or 10/2. We will continue to provide updates via the EIDS message box. We appreciate your patience as DODD works to resolve these problems.

Early Track/EIDS Exits

As of this week, DODD is caught up on copying exits into Early Track that occurred and were entered 8/29 or later in EIDS. This will help ensure accurate data entry for transfers or children who are re-referred. Exits from the previous day will be copied over each business day going forward. As such, you no longer need to contact EIDS regarding transfers, and can simply contact Central Intake to do so. If for some reason the exit information is missing for a child in Early Track, e-mail EIDS@dodd.ohio.gov and we will complete the data entry in Early Track.

Creating an EIDS Account

For new EIDS users, part of the process of gaining access to EIDS involves creating a DODD portal account. For users who currently have a DODD portal account for another application, it involves requesting that EIDS be added to their current account. *Once you have received confirmation about your DODD portal account, please forward your confirmation e-mail to EIDS@dodd.ohio.gov.* There is one final step that we need to complete within the EIDS application to finalize your account access.

SFY 2017 TRS Baseline

The SFY17 TRS baseline analysis process is underway. Counties had until August 15 to review data and submit any necessary deletion requests or other inquiries. Revised missing data inquiries and child record verification requests were sent to applicable counties on September 19 and are now due back October 2, reflecting the revised timeline. In the event of unexpected glitches with the transition from Early Track to EIDS, EI Monitoring staff will be as flexible as possible with the affected counties.
