## **New EIDS Features**

With the implementation of the Central Intake data entry in EIDS, a function has been added to allow Central Intake to upload documents directly into EIDS. When they do so, anyone who has access to the record can view the attachments using the "Manage Documents" left menu option. DODD is aware of a bug for files that have been uploaded with commas and other special characters in the filename and IT is working to resolve the issue.

DODD added two new Central Intake reports to EIDS that are accessible to EIDS users with EI roles, as well. The *Central Intake Contacts* report includes all contacts entered during a user-specified time period, along with all of the fields entered on the contact log. The *Referrals Extract* includes all Central Intake and EI referrals that occurred within the user-specified time period, along with the accompanying information. This report will ultimately replace the Program Referral Extract, but the Program Referral Extract will continue to be available for about the next month for quality assurance purposes.

### **Guidance for County-to-County Transfers in EIDS**

With input from Bright Beginnings and the EIDS user group, DODD drafted guidance for local EI programs and Central Intake regarding each entity's responsibilities when transferring a child from one county to another in the Early Intervention Data System (EIDS). ## **Transferred Records Fixed in EIDS**

All records in EIDS that have been transferred from one county to another county are fixed. Screenings, evaluations, and assessments from previous records should all be correctly copied into the new, transferred record. Diagnoses were not copied to the new record, so for any transferred child that was made eligible via a diagnosis, the diagnosis can be entered with the date your county obtained the child's record. Now that central intake is doing data entry directly in EIDS, issues related to the county-to-county transfer will be eliminated for transfers after June 30.

### SFY18 Transition Analyses (Group 1)

Activities related to the SFY18 Transition Steps and Services and Transition Planning Conference (TPC) baseline analyses are underway. County inquiries were due back to DODD June 22. Verification and final analyses have begun, and results memos will be sent in early August.

### August 1 LEA (all counties)

The August 1 LEA quarterly report requirement is approaching. The report may be run in EIDS no earlier than July 22, 2018 and must be sent to the appropriate LEAs no later than August 1, 2018. Please do *not* submit copies to DODD, but you are encouraged to maintain copies on file.

If you are not sure which LEA should be selected for a specific child (e.g., foster care situation), we encourage you to contact the relevant Educational Service Center (ESC) for clarification. Contact information for all of the ESCs and Public School Districts, along with a map of districts, is available here:
