PROGRAM UPDATES

Access to MyLearning

There was an error in the MyLearning training instructions that accompanied Program Updates #1919. We have updated the instructions on the website and the most current instructions accompany this communication. We apologize for the inconvenience.

2019 EI Family Questionnaire

SFY19 45-Day Analysis (Group 2)

Activities related to the SFY19 45-Day analysis are underway. Data were extracted on August 28. County inquiries were sent September 5 and due back September 24. DODD will offer a clarification period, when applicable, and will work to finalize results over the next couple of months. Results memos will be sent in late October.

Recently Added Data Collection in EIDS

With the June 27 Early Intervention Data System (EIDS) release, pages were added to the EIDS for counties to document when referrals are made to ODH Home Visiting programs and to enter system of payments (SOP) data as documented on EI-15. Any time a referral is made to an ODH Home Visiting program by an EI Service Coordinator, the referral should be documented in EIDS. Please note: this feature in EIDS only *documents* that the referral has been made; it will not create a referral to Home Visiting for the EI Service Coordinator. In order to refer a family to Home Visiting, please contact central intake.

The EI-15 is required to be completed prior to initial and annual IFSPs and should be documented in EIDS at these intervals.

DODD will be extracting data in both of these areas at the end of September/beginning of October to verify that these data are being entered in EIDS. The HV Referrals and SOP Extract reports are available for counties to examine these data prior to DODD's review.

Authentic Assessment in Early Intervention Online Training

This module was developed by a workgroup from the Early Intervention-Early Childhood Professional Development Community of Practice and is part of a Universal Online Part C EI curriculum. It is available free of charge on the Virginia EI Professional Development website.

The course addresses authentic assessment in early intervention. The lessons include the following: (1) What is Authentic Assessment; (2) Understanding Why; (3) Who, Where, When, and Within; and (4) Putting It All Together. It includes interactive activities, self-reflections and suggestions for applying the knowledge to your work with infants and toddlers and their families. Some of the activities involve reflecting with a peer or supervisor.

Once you have completed the module and passed the assessment, you will receive a certificate of completion from the Virginia EI Professional Development website. The module has been approved for two hours of DODD EI-DS and DODD EI-SC CPDUs. Applications for social work, physical therapy, and occupational therapy CPDUs are pending.

To access the module, you will begin by creating an account. Follow these steps:

1. Navigate to Virginia's Early Intervention Professional Development Center

2. Click on Authentic Assessment.
3. Click button to enter course.
4. Click the Create New Account button.
5. Enter the information on the account page and click Create my new account.
6. You will receive an email asking you to confirm your account. Click the link, then click the Continue button.
7. Once confirmed, you will be returned to the Enrollment page. Click Enroll Me.
8. The course will launch. Click on Lesson 1 to begin.

MyLearning Instructions Early Intervention

Anyone with an OH|ID or DODD portal account can access MyLearning. This means anyone with access to EIDS or any other DODD application has access. If you do not have an account, here are the instructions to create one:

1. Navigate to dodd.ohio.gov
2. Click **Login**, located near the top of the page.
3. Enter your OH|ID username and password.
4. If you do not have an OH|ID, click Create New Account and follow the instructions. **Note: When asked to choose your profile, select “I want to be a DODD provider.” When asked to choose your user job function, select “Agency employee.”** This will result in your account being auto-approved.
5. Complete the email verification step to activate your account.
6. After logging in successfully, click **MyLearning**, located near the top of the page.
7. You can search for courses from the MyLearning Home page using either the title search or the keywords search. Or you can click the Early Intervention tile to launch the list of EI trainings.
8. Click the name of the training you want to attend.
9. Click View Course.
10. Click Enroll Me.
