PROGRAM UPDATES

February 1 Local Educational Agency (LEA) Notification

The February 1 Quarterly LEA Reports are used for the state's annual compliance analysis related to LEA notification. Copies were due to DODD by February 2. Data analysis is currently in progress and memos will be sent in the coming weeks.

SFY21 Timely Receipt of Services (TRS) Baseline

Activities related to the SFY21 TRS baseline analysis are underway. DODD extracted data for the analysis from EIDS on December 16 and sent verification requests and missing data inquiries to applicable counties on January 8. These were due back to DODD by January 27. Results memos are scheduled to be sent by March 19.

SFY21 45-Day Baseline

Activities related to the 45-Day Baseline analysis are underway. DODD sent emails notifying counties about their inclusion in the analysis on January 13. Applicable counties had until February 2 to make any needed edits to data, including requesting deletions. DODD will extract data for the baseline analysis on February 16 and send compliance inquiries to applicable counties by March 4.

New Guidance Document about IFSP Outcomes
