Obtaining an Evidence-Based Practice Coach

There are a variety of ways for a newly certified one- year developmental specialist (DS) to access required evidence-based practice (EBP) coaching.

- We encourage employers to seek out EBP coaches within their organization. If there is a five or ten- year certified DS working on your current EI team(s), they would just need to complete the online training course to be eligible to coach a one- year DS.

- The supervisor of a one- year DS (who holds current five or ten- year DS certification) may serve as an EBP coach after completion of online training requirement. Time spent coaching would need to be separate from administrative supervision.
- Reach out to neighboring county early intervention programs and regional councils of governments to see if they have staff eligible and available to coach a new, one-year DS.
- DODD has contracted with OCALI to provide a limited number of EBP coaches for hiring entities who are unable to locate a coach independently. Please reach out to Laura Maddox (laura_maddox@ocali.org) for additional information.
- Current five and ten- year certified DSs: please consider giving back and become an evidence-based practice coach for a newly certified developmental specialist! Virtual meetings are acceptable, and coaching is a great way to increase skills in peer mentoring, reflective practice, and leadership. As many as twenty documented hours spent by an evidence-based practice coach actively participating in evidence-based practice coaching will count as professional development for certification renewal. 
The Project Open House (Phase II) grant at the University of Toledo is currently being funded by the Ohio Developmental Disabilities Council. We are hoping to explore how ODJFS subsidy payments are being used to support the inclusion of young children with IEPs or IFSPs in publicly funded early care and education programs, including childcare programs. We plan to conduct a series of focus group interviews to address the purpose of this study and to get feedback from families and providers affected by these subsidies.

WIC Infant Formula Alternatives

For powdered formula, check your benefit balance to see how many cans you can buy. You can mix and match sizes and brands. A card change is NOT required for most items.

12-24 oz powder container = **1 container** from your benefits

27 oz or larger powder container = **2 containers** from your benefits

Below is a guide to Ohio WIC-approved substitutes for certain brands or sizes of infant formula. Due to the current formula shortage, you may temporarily use your WIC Nutrition Card to purchase the substitute infant formula below: Only those with larger sizes of Nutramigen (19.8oz and 27.8oz), EnfaCare (23oz), and NeoSure (22.8oz) on their card will need to return for a card change.

Formula Shortage Tips

Tips to Share with Participants

- Call the store first and ask for product availability.
- Ask the store worker if there is more formula in the back if there is not any on the shelf.
- Ask the store when the next shipment arrives.
- Ask the store when shelves are usually stocked.
- Talk to the pharmacy to see if they can help.
- Do not wait until the end of the month to purchase your benefits.
- Call your child's healthcare provider about prescribing an alternative formula if the one currently prescribed is unavailable or difficult to find.
- If you do not see the formula you need on the shelf, consider asking a store associate for assistance. If the first person you ask is unsure, consider asking a second associate.
- Do not dilute your formula. Follow instructions for safe formula mixing.
- Do not try to make homemade formula.
- If you rely on WIC benefits for your formula and are unable to locate it at a WIC vendor, consider going to a non-WIC store to purchase formula with your SNAP or TANF benefits.
- If your child is on specialty formula, talk to the store pharmacy. If you are in the Columbus or Dayton areas, try calling Central Ohio Specialty Care at (614) 790-0200. If you are in the Cleveland area, please try calling (216) 930-5530.
- Consult with your healthcare provider if you are considering replacing formula feedings with any other non-formula, food, or liquid (milk, juice, baby foods).
- Formula and/or breast milk sales or donations from individuals via the internet are not regulated.
- If considering increasing breast milk supply or relactating, reach out to WIC for help or call the 24/7 Breastfeeding Hotline at 888-588-3423 or text "BFHOTLINE" to 839863.
- If funds are available, and a medical need is present, pasteurized donor milk may be available, at cost, through the [Ohio Health Mother's Milk Bank](#): 614-566-0630.
- If no resolution, contact the local WIC office.
