Upcoming SFY24 45-Day Baseline

SFY24 45-Day Timeline baseline activities will begin this month for Group 3. Applicable counties will have until November 30 to review their data in the EI Data System (EIDS) to ensure data are up-to-date and accurate. DODD will conduct a webinar on November 15 to review the baseline process for 45-Day timelines. EI Service Coordination Oversight Report Guide

A revised version of the SC Oversight Report Guide has been posted to the Ohio EI website. Changes were made to the instructions contained in Appendix B, so it will be important to use the updated version when preparing your report. Both the oversight report template and guide are available here:

The oversight report must be completed twice a year by the Early Intervention contract manager and presented to the relevant local Family and Children First Council (FCFC). The first report must be shared with local council not later than February 29, 2024 and cover activities occurring between July 1, 2023 and December 31, 2023 period. The second report must be shared with local council not later than August 31, 2024 and cover activities occurring between January 1,

EI Contract Manager Training Requirements

- Service Coordination Duties and Process (EI-070)
- The IFSP Process (EI-076)

Contract managers hired after July 1, 2023, must complete these trainings within six months of hire. Please contact your EI program consultant with any questions.
