#### **PROGRAM UPDATES**

May 1 Local Educational Agency (LEA) Notification

As a reminder, the quarterly LEA reporting requirement is coming up at the end of the month. Under Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 5180-10-02(L)(1)(a), the EI service coordination agency must notify the LEA (with parent consent) of children who will turn three within the next year by the first day of February, May, August, and November.

This report is available in the EI Data System (EIDS) in both Excel and PDF formats. You may use either version, but please remember the following:

- The May 1 LEA report must be run no earlier than April 21 and no later than May 1.
- It is expected that child information will be updated in a timely manner to ensure the LEA reports in EIDS are accurate.
- Only the sections of the report that are relevant to a particular LEA should be sent to that LEA, not the entire report.
- If you are not sure which LEA should be selected for a specific child, we encourage you to contact the relevant educational service center (ESC) for clarification. Contact information for all of the ESCs and public school districts, along with a map of districts, is available here:

This quarterly report must be provided to the LEAs no later than May 1. The report does **not** need to be submitted to DCY, but we encourage you to keep a copy for your records. ### 2025 EI Family Questionnaire

In the April 1 EI Program Update, we announced that the 2025 EI Family Questionnaire process would follow the same timeline as 2024. We now anticipate that questionnaires will be distributed in mid- to late May. State Fiscal Year 2025 (SFY25) Timely Receipt of Services (TRS) and Transition Baseline Analyses

The SFY25 TRS and Transition baseline activities are underway. Compliance inquiries were sent to all participating counties on March 20 and due back to DCY by April 10. DCY is currently reviewing submitted information, requesting clarification information as needed, and incorporating inquiry data. The final analysis is expected to be completed and results memos sent by June 17.

### SFY25 45-Day Baseline Analysis

Activities related to the SFY25 45-Day baseline compliance analysis are also underway. DCY hosted a webinar on March 25 to go over the 45-Day baseline process. The webinar slides and recording have been posted to the Ohio EI website and can be accessed <a href="here">here</a>. Included counties have until April 17 to review and clean their data and until April 22 to re-enter data after any applicable data deletions. Compliance data for the analysis will be extracted on April 23rd.

### Federal Fiscal Year 2025 (FFY25) Part C Application

The Department of Children and Youth (DCY) will be applying this upcoming fiscal year for federal Part C funds. The application for funding has been posted for 60 days of public participation. The department will accept public comment on the application through April 20 and the application will remain posted through May 20. You can access the application here:
