

Key Principle #6:
The family's priorities, needs, and interests are addressed most appropriately by a primary provider who represents and receives team and community support.

SC, DS, PT, OT,
SLP

and/or joint visits**

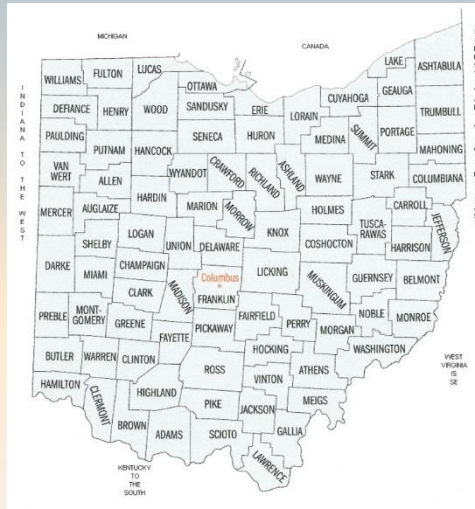
**Regular team
